TERMS OF USE of single case IDB data

(Version of April 2020)

Processing and use of IDB data is subject to the Regulation 2016/679 of the European Parliament and the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, as well as to internal rules of the IDB-Network and the data host. The "Terms of Use" shall be signed by every user of single case IDB data and signed agreements shall be kept on file by the data processor.

The user of IDB single case data agrees to the following terms and conditions:

- Single-record data is to be used for internal purposes only. The user will not give access to single-record data to a third party.
- Single-record data shall not be published or disseminated to the public, neither to a third party.
- The user will not link IDB data to other information in order to identify natural persons.
- The user may use the data only for research or analyses serving public interest in the area of public health and safety, i.e. preventing injuries and promoting safety.
- Whenever publishing any results of such research or analyses, the user will indicate
 the source ("Source: EU Injury Database (IDB))" in text, tables, figures, and list of
 literature. Any publication using IDB data shall be notified to the Network-Coordinator.
- Data suppliers, network-coordinator, or data controller cannot be hold responsible for any outcome or conclusions of research and analyses.
- The analysis of the single case IDB data takes place in compliance with the national data protection legislation of the user's country.
- The user will use data only during the period of time, for which the use is granted, e.g. by valid membership in the IDB Network.
- Any breach of these Terms will result in an immediate and definitive suppression of the access to single case IDB data. Any user who breached the contract carries the full responsibilities for any consequent legal act.
