Research Question

Which sectors are relevant for child injury prevention?

- We identified 27 sector applicable to child safety
- 9 designated "core sectors"

Road Safety

- 21 sectors identified
- Most prominently transport (27%) of stakeholders categorised to transport followed by health (16%) and media (10%)
- Number of sectors surprising given the strong position of transport sector, but goes to show how multi-sectoral the issue is.

Home Safety

- 16 sectors identified
- Health appeared to be the most active with 42%
- Also prominent were media, social/ welfare services, consumers and housing

Water Safety

- Health again most prominent 26% stakeholders
- Emergency services (13%) maritime affairs, consumers, environment
- Position of core sectors was less pronounced in water safety than the other domains

Intentional Injury Prevention

- 13 sectors identified
- Health highly represented at 30%
- Social/welfare services (19%), justice (14%), education (9%) and media (8%)
- Core sectors highly represented

Reflections

- Core sectors indicate links and similarities between domains
- Variety of 27 sectors and distribution between domains reflects diversity in child injury prevention
- Results also indicate 'relevance of whole of government' and 'whole of society' approaches to child injury prevention

Conclusion

- Child injury prevention requires intersectoral cooperation
- Identified sectors provides practical guidance to practitioners planning partnerships
 - Reframe issue using relevant sectors terminology
 - Identify synergies between the goals of different sectors
